## SLIDING BARN DOOR DESK







## **CUTS FOR THE DOOR FRAMES**





Start by making your 3/4" pocket holes in your plywood pieces. Next, attach the bottom base pieces to the side pieces using 1.25" pocket hole screws. Note that the base pieces should line up 1.75" from the bottom of both side pieces.








Create the face frame by attaching each piece as shown through the 3/4" pocket holes and into the joining boards. It's a good idea to measure your boxes you just created first to make sure the measurements are the same.




Now attach the face frame to the boxes. You will do this by using 1.25" pocket hole screws through the pocket holes on the sides of the boxes as well as the bottom of the box pieces. You can also attach the long side pieces with wood glue and 1.25" finish nails through the face frame and into the boxes.







Cut the back plywood pieces and attach them using 5/8" staple into the back of the desk.



can be added where you need them. I placed mine 11.5" from the bases of the desk. Attach them using 1.25" pocket hole screws through the bottom of each shelf and into the sides.

The final step is building the doors. Create the frames by attaching the shorter boards to the longer boards using 1.25" pocket hole screws. You can have fun with the inside of the doors! I used faux tin panels on mine, but lots of materials will do. Check out our website for a link to that as well as a link to the video showing how we build our own DIY barn door hardware!
